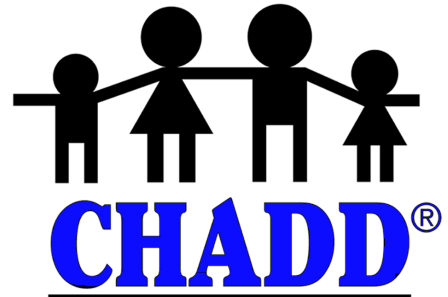

Students with AD/HD are both impaired and impairing. The deficits associated with this common childhood disorder significantly undermine the student's ability to achieve school-related success.

The tragedy of AD/HD is that children with the disorder may develop emotional scars that outlast the AD/HD symptoms.

However, parents and teachers may temper this emotional trauma by creating a home or school environment that encourages the child to be resilient and to overcome adversity. This workshop will focus on the problem deficits and then present strategies that parents and educators can use to help these children survive their AD/HD.



Terry Illes, Ph.D, has been employed as a school psychologist for the Jordan School District in the Salt Lake City area for over twenty years. He was a member of a team that developed a Care Process Treatment Model for AD/HD for Intermountain Healthcare, the largest HMO in Utah.

Illes teaches classes on the educational and home management of ADHD. He is a former member of the National CHADD Board of Directors and is a member of the National CHADD **Parent to Parent: Family Training on ADHD** Teacher Certification team.
